LINK Kollel Hosts Rabbi Yerachmiel Fried

The LINK Kollel in Los Angeles hosted Rabbi Yerachmiel Fried, *rosh kollel* of DATA in Dallas, for an inspiring *Shabbaton* over *Shabbos Parshas Yisro*. Over a hundred people heard at least part of his many illuminating *shiurim* and *drashos*.

Rabbi Fried spoke at an *oneg Shabbos* about his fond memories of interacting with Rav Shlomo Zalman Auerbach while he was a *kollel yungerman* in Yerushalayim back in the '80s and early '90s. He would drive Rav Shlomo Zalman once a week and discuss many *halacha shailos* with him. Those *halachic* decisions formed the basis of Rabbi Fried's classic work, "*Yom Tov Sheini K'hilchasa*," which is the definitive work, in Hebrew and English, on the subject. Rabbi Fried shared his recollections of witnessing Rav Shlomo Zalman's tremendous *middos bein adam lachaveiro* and his awe-inspiring *ahavas Yisroel*.

He gave two *halacha shiurim*. One was about *hilchos mezuzah*, focusing on those who are afraid to put a *mezuzah* outside their door because of anti-Semitism, and another one was about the *halachos* of Americans in Eretz Yisroel and Israelis in America on the second day of *Yom Tov*.

He also gave a *drosha* about the deeper meaning of *naaseh* venishma. He stated that our goal is to reach the level *Klal Yisroel* attained at that moment, becoming true *ovdei Hashem* and completely fusing our will with His.

Rabbi Fried spoke before *Mincha* about the *halachic* obligation to remember *Maamad Har Sinai* daily. Rebbetzin Marcy Fried gave a *shiur* for women on *Shabbos* afternoon titled "Per-

fectly Imperfect: The Art of Being Your Best Self," an inspirational talk on character development and personal growth.

In an inspiring talk at seudah shlishis, Rabbi Fried described how his kollel was successful in kiruv. Before sharing some inspiring vignettes, he relayed the advice he received at the outset from Rav Zelig Epstein, who spoke to him about the innate holiness of every Jewish soul, even those far removed from the world of Torah. Rabbi Fried elaborated, based on the teachings of Rav Chaim Volozhiner, that there are different levels of the Jewish soul, demonstrating a very profound connection that we all have with our Creator, no matter how assimilated a Jew may be. In that context, he relayed a story about how Rav Chaim Berlin, the chief rabbi of Moscow in the early 1900s, performed a secret bris on a Jew whose profession was selling religious icons for the Russian Orthodox Church. Even that Jew, despite his seemingly complete alienation from Torah and *mitzvos*, expressed a deep longing for his children to be connected to Yiddishkeit. It was with that ethos that Rabbi Fried and his colleagues approached hundreds of secular Jews to interest them in Torah study. And the results are legendary.

On Sunday morning, Rabbi Fried gave an advanced *shiur* about whether *kabbolas mitzvos* is essential for a *geirus* to be effectuated. (Rabbi Fried is the author of a comprehensive *halachic* study of the laws of *geirus*.)

The attendees of Rabbi Fried's talks were moved by his words and impressed by the depth of his Torah scholarship. LINK wished Rabbi Fried and his *rebbetzin* well on their forth-coming move to Eretz Yisroel in July, when he will open a *kollel* in Ramat Beit Shemesh.
